L.A. County Supervisor Don Knabe Joins Executive Committee

CCA welcomed **Supervisor Don Knabe** as the special guest to this month's Executive Committee meeting, hosted by **Patina Restaurant Group** at the Dorothy Chandler Pavilion. Supervisor Knabe represents L.A. County's Fourth District, which includes over two million people and two of the nation's largest economic hubs: the Ports of Los Angeles and Long Beach and Los Angeles International Airport. A proven leader on fiscal matters, Supervisor Knabe was pleased to report that after closing the books on the 2008-2009 budget, the County had a small surplus to add to the reserve fund. Years of fiscal responsibility and conservative spending have enabled the County to maintain the services it provides to its residents. Supervisor Knabe also emphasized the importance of creating jobs to stimulate the economy, and announced that over 8,300 temporary jobs have been created through the program he introduced in March, which utilizes federal funding available through the Federal Stimulus Package to create subsidized employment opportunities.

- Councilmember Jose Huizar and CCA member Melendrez Design Partners unveiled the **Broadway Streetscape Master Plan**, which is part of a 10-year plan to revitalize Broadway. The streetscape plan boldly prioritizes people over vehicles, and provides much-needed infrastructure support and major improvements, while providing a showcase for the Downtown L.A. Streetcar and the revitalization of the Historic Broadway Theatre District. The next steps for the streetscape plan include environmental review and city adoption.
