### STATE & CITY OF LOS ANGELES BALLOT

<u>Item</u>	<u>Related to...</u>	<u>Description</u>	<u>CCA Votes...</u>
<b>Prop. 1A</b>	Transportation	Prevents the State from using gasoline taxes collected through Prop 42 for anything other than transportation projects.	<b>YES</b>
<b>Prop. 1B</b>	Transportation (Bond)	\$19.9 billion bond to pay for transportation projects. More than half will be used to improve freeways and local roads. L.A. will receive close to 40% of the funds.	<b>YES</b>
<b>Prop. 1C</b>	Housing (Bond)	\$2.9 billion bond to build affordable housing for low-income and elderly Californians. Downtown L.A. will be eligible for significant transit-oriented development dollars.	<b>YES</b>
<b>Prop. 1D</b>	Education (Bond)	\$10.4 billion bond for construction and modernizations of schools, community colleges, and UC and Cal State schools.	<b>YES</b>
<b>Prop. 1E</b>	Flood Control (Bond)	\$4.1 billion bond for levee improvements, flood control and flood mapping.	<b>YES</b>
<b>Prop. 84</b>	Water Quality (Bond)	\$5.4 billion for safe drinking water, water quality, flood control, natural resource protection, and park improvements.	<b>YES</b>
<b>Prop. 87</b>	Alternative Energy (Tax)	Tax on the production of oil in order to fund over \$4 billion of alternative energy programs. There is no guarantee this money will be spent in the state.	<b>NO</b>
<b>Prop. 88</b>	Education (Tax)	Parcel (property) tax to fund K-12 education programs. California does not currently impose a parcel tax.	<b>NO</b>
<b>Prop. 89</b>	Campaign Financing (Tax)	Tax increase on corporations and financial institutions to fund public campaigns, putting the financial burden entirely on the private sector.	<b>NO</b>
<b>Prop. 90</b>	Eminent Domain	Requires the government to pay property owners for substantial economic losses resulting from new laws and limits authority to take land. This law will result in unbridled lawsuits and will harm California's economy.	<b>NO</b>
<b>Prop. H</b>	City Housing (Bond)	\$1 billion housing bond that will provide over 10,000 new affordable units in the City. The measure also promotes homebuyer assistance programs and is critical in Los Angeles' effort to address the affordable housing crisis.	<b>YES</b>
<b>Prop. J</b>	Fire Stations	A technical amendment that allows the L.A.F.D. to build stations on sites less than two acres. This will enable L.A.F.D. to better operate in dense urban areas.	<b>YES</b>
<b>Prop. R</b>	Term Limits / Ethics	Increases City Council term limits from two terms to three; and revises ethics laws with regard to lobbying.	<b>YES</b>
